

Mines and Minerals (Declaration of Minerals) Notice, 1990

---

THE Minister of Mines, in terms of subsection (3) of section 5 of the Mines and Minerals Act [Chapter 165], hereby makes the following notice:—

1. This notice may be cited as the Mines and Minerals (Declaration of Minerals) Notice, 1990.
2. The substance specified in the First Schedule is declared to be a mineral for the purposes of all the provisions of the Act.
3. The substances specified in the Second Schedule are declared not to be minerals for the purposes of any of the provisions of the Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE (Section 2)

SUBSTANCE DECLARED TO BE MINERAL

Bat guano, where it occurs in quantities sufficiently great to warrant extraction by mining or quarrying.

SECOND SCHEDULE (Section 3)

SUBSTANCES DECLARED NOT TO BE MINERALS

Sand, clay and stone, including limestone, *bona fide* required and used within Zimbabwe for any one or more of the following purposes—

- (a) building;
- (b) the manufacture of bricks or tiles;
- (c) the construction of monuments;
- (d) the construction of roads, railways or bridges;
- (e) the construction of dams, reservoirs, weirs, canals or other irrigation works.
